TRUMPET VINE GUIDELINES

Trumpet Vine news appears in the Spring and Fall issues of the Long Island Gardener. Garden clubs are to send their club news to their respective county section chairman for review and editing 10 days before it is due January 1st and July 1st. The edited news will then be forwarded to the Long Island Gardener editor on January 10th for the spring issue or July 10th for the fall issue.

The trumpet Vine reports are a wonderful way for all of our clubs to share their activities with other Second District Clubs. The report is limited to no more than 90 words. Photos are welcome and are limited to illustrations of some event, activity or project the club has had. Shots of lines of people do not tell the story the club wants to share. The photos should be sent as attachments to the report.

The content of the report must reflect what the club has done over the past months, not what is planned for in the future.

Some interesting material to share would be:

- Names of speakers and the topics they presented

- Names of designers whose program was enjoyed by the members

- Successful activities in horticulture or design that's been done intra-club

- Description of activities done with children

- Description of community service activities

- Description of garden therapy activities

- Trips the club has taken

- Projects the club is working on to protect the environment

- Community education projects the club is involved in

Please be alert to our space limitations and monitor the word count. While we know that the club wants to share a number of activities, please highlight one or two in each issue.
